



Foreign Office
November 2nd, 1917

Dear Lord Rothschild,

I have much pleasure in conveying to you, on behalf of His Majesty's Government, the following declaration of sympathy with Jewish Zionist aspirations which has been submitted to, and approved by, the Cabinet

His Majesty's Government view with favour the establishment in Palestine of a national home for the Jewish people, and will use their best endeavors to facilitate the achievement of this object, it being clearly understood that nothing shall be done which may prejudice the civil and religious rights of existing non-Jewish communities in Palestine or the rights and political status enjoyed by Jews in any other country.

I should be grateful if you would bring this declaration to the knowledge of the Zionist Federation.

Source 7: Promises and assurances made to the Arabs 1916-19

Date	Occasion	Substance
Running from 14th July 1915 to 30th Jan 1916	<u>McMahon-Hussein correspondence</u> Sir Henry McMahon was British High Commissioner in Egypt, and Sharif Hussein was the ruler of the Emirate of Mecca	The British Government promised support for an independent Arab state in areas then under the rule of the Ottoman Empire in return for an Arab rebellion against the Ottomans.
2nd November 1917	<u>Balfour Declaration</u> in the form of a letter from British Foreign Secretary Arthur Balfour to Walter Rothschild, 2nd Baron Rothschild, leader of the British Jewish community.	Mainly a promise to the Jews about a national home in Palestine but it contains the provision nothing shall be done which may prejudice the religious and civil rights of existing non-Jewish communities in Palestine.'
January 1918	Following the publication of the Balfour Declaration the British sent <u>Commander David George Hogarth</u> to see Hussein	He carried the message that the "political and economic freedom" of the Palestinian population was not in question. Hogarth reported that Hussein "would not accept an independent Jewish State in Palestine, nor was I instructed to warn him that such a state was contemplated by Great Britain".
16th June 1918	<u>The Declaration to the Seven</u> Read out by an officer of the Arab Bureau to a meeting of 7 Arab leaders.	The British government promised independence for Arabs under the principle of 'consent of the governed'.
7th November 1918	<u>Anglo French Declaration</u> copies were posted in all Arab towns and villages then occupied by Allied forces, including Palestine.	"The goal of [...] France and Great Britain in prosecuting [...] the war [...] is the complete and final liberation of the peoples who have so long been oppressed by the Turks, and the setting up of national governments and administrations deriving their authority from the free exercise [...] of the choice of the indigenous populations"



Source 16: Extract of Plan Dalet, a military operation carried out by Haganah during the 1948 war. It instructed on the clearing and dismantling of Arab communities.

‘Mounting operations against enemy population centers located inside or near our defensive system in order to prevent them from being used as bases by an active armed force. These operations can be divided into the following categories:

Destruction of villages (setting fire to, blowing up, and planting mines in the debris), especially those population centers which are difficult to control continuously

Mounting search and control operations according to the following guidelines: encirclement of the village and conducting a search inside it. In the event of resistance, the armed force must be destroyed and the population must be expelled outside the borders of the state.’

On the Destruction of Israel:

'Israel will exist and will continue to exist until Islam will obliterate it, just as it obliterated others before it.' (Preamble)

The Exclusive Moslem Nature of the Area:

'The land of Palestine is an Islamic Waqf [Holy Possession] consecrated for future Moslem generations until Judgment Day. No one can renounce it or any part, or abandon it or any part of it.'
(Article 11)

'Palestine is an Islamic land... Since this is the case, the Liberation of Palestine is an individual duty for every Moslem


